state of New York and married his wife
there, as it was said, I did not see them married
but they came back home to fathers house in
Ohio and lived together and raised a
big family of children. Her maiden name
was Lora Reebe. she has not married since
her husbands death. She and her husband
have been loyal and true to the Government
of the United States all their lives, and she did
not at any time give aid or comfort to
the enemies of the Government in the
late Rebellion
