 Benjamin Poney of Stratford according to two Exec-
 utions for Debt and Charges that the

 of November 1706 appraised two par-
 cels of arable Land presented by the J^r John Tyrrell
 to the J^r County Sheriff for satisfying the J^r Judg-

 parcel of Land lying on the Westward side of that
 lot called the Spring Lot being the whole length of y^e
 lot and being in Quantity half an Acre and eleven

 Southward the J^r John Torrills Land Eastward with
 a highway and Southward the J^r John Torrills Land which
 parcel is valued at three pounds four shillings and four pence
 as aforesaid which Sums of Money amount to y^e total Sum
 of twenty five pounds six shillings and eight pence
 which is the Estate of the J^r Tyrrell by the Executions
 aforesaid and were by the J^r Tyrrell delivered to the Sheriff
 as aforesaid with the Appurtenances thereof. We Wit-
