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George Clarke Son hath for his half Division of one hood, whereof one Parcell Containing Six Acres and a half boe it more or less, Called by the Name of Six Acres piece bounded with the Common East with the fence South, with a high way North, with Phillip Hatlows West, also another Parcell Containing two Acres and three Roods, and to Equall it to other Land thirty pole, in all two Acres three Roods, and thirty pole boe it more or less, Lyth on lower pond plains, bounded with a high way North, with the fence South, with the Common East and West, (note, two Acres one Rood and thirty pole in Six Acres piece, and thirty pole of that in lower pond plains is not to be Charged with Rates: (note, the last parcell lying att the lower pond gate is Exchanged with the Town:

George Clark Son hath for his Second Division of Meadows, one Acre one Rood and thirty Six pole, boe it more or less, lying in the first Meadow, bounded with a high way South, with John Browns East, with the Common North, with W^r Peter, Prudons West.

Thomas Camfield hath for Second Division Land three Acres and a half and for his half Division of Land, one Acre and three Roods, and to Equall it to other Land one Rood and four pole, in all five Acres a half and four pole boe it more or less, lying in the New Meadow Plains bounded with the Common East and West, with Thomas Fords North, with Jasper Gunns South, (note, one Rood and four pole for Satisfaction is not to be Charged with Rates:

Jasper Gunn hath for his half Division of Land Six Acres and for Satisfaction for his home Lott, one Rood and to Equall it to other Land one Acre and a half in all seven Acres, and three Roods boe it more or less lying on the New Meadow plains bounded with the Common East and West, and South, with Thomas Camfield North, (note, one Acre and a half is not to be Charged with Rates

Thomas Camfield hath given him by Jasper Gunn the above named parcell of Land.

Thomas Camfield hath for his Division of Meadows two Acres, and to Equall it to other Meadows half an Acre in all two Acres and a half boe it more or less, lying in the lower pond Meadows, bounded with Thomas Fords North with a Rood and Thomas Hines West, with the Common East and South, (note) half an Acre for Satisfaction is not to be Charged with Rates

Thomas Samford hath for his half Division of Land twelve Acres and to Equall it to other Land four Acres and a half, lying on the first Meadow plains bounded with a high way East and West with the Common North, with John Blatchers South, (note, four Acres and a half of this not to be Charged with Rates:

Thomas Samford hath for his Second Division of Meadows, one Acre a half and twenty six pole, boe it more or less lying in the first Meadow, bounded with a high way East with the Common West with William East, South, and with Andrew Tomlin North.
