

John Smith granted an Acre of Land, next to that he purchased of the said John. In case William Roberts, and his agree-
ment, that acre is to be beyond the land of William Roberts.

A Generall Court at Milford December 24th 1646

Ordered that Roger Corroth is to give backe againe, that Land which is in his possession, which was laid out for Philip Hatley.

Ordered that all and every part and part of, of every mans Land, both w^{ch} and meadow, and house lots shall be recorded in the Court booke for that purpose, and what sooner part, or parts of any mans Land, shall be sold, or alienated, or exchanged, or given, from time to time, or at any time hereafter it shall be brought, by either he or they, who bought the said Land, or meadow, unto him appointed to record, to be entered in the said booke of records, and by both the parties whose exchange, or bargain hath it a gift, before the next tithing court, next after the bargain or alienation. And such Land or meadow, so exchanged, or given, upon pain of forfeiture double the writt of redempcion, and what other damage may follow, upon such defaults. And he who is appointed to enter the aforesaid Lands, or meadow, shall give into the next tithing court, after such alienations, exchanges or gifts, a copie of such alienations, exchanges, or gifts, as have been before, that accordingly the court may know, & dispose such rates as are due upon the right and known owner of the Land, from time to time, and may cause the treasurer to require, that which is just upon every man.

And it is further ordered that every man shall bring to the Court appointed to be recorded, all and every part, and parts of his Land, meadow, and house lots, within two months after the date hereof, upon pain of forfeiture double the writt of redempcion, and what other damages may follow, that he may be better, and bound, and such high wayes proposed, may be made for the townes use, and that these rates shall be gathered by the Recorder, and put into the townes treasury, and for the recording of every souerall part of his Land, or house lots, the owner of the Land shall pay the Recorder 2 pence, and if the owner of the Land shall pay any part, or parts, he shall pay to the Recorder 1 pence.

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
