Gould

Mr. Benjamin Gould hath one Parcel of Land given him by the town for
pasture now in Charles Lott, Containing five acres and one half and to
equal it to other lands one acre and one Rod in all three acres and then
acres and three Rods be it more or less, being bounded with Mr. Charles Lott
and a parcel of Land granted to Mr. Norton, on the North, and Northwest
with part of Mr. Charles Lott and East and South and South West
with the Common or high ways. That that one acre and one Rod of this parcel
is not to be charged with rates.

Roger
Cerrill

Roger Cerrill hath two acres of Land lying in the West field and to equal
it with other lands six acres in all eight acres be it more or less, being bound
with his own Land East Joseph Northrupps Land South, and the Common West
and North.

George
Carr

George Carr hath a part of his half Division of Land lying in the
Great Rock adjoining to his own land at the East End of it one parcel
containing four acres, bounded with the Common East, his own Land West, and a
high way South, and the Common North, and another parcel at the South End
containing one acre bounded with his own Land East, Engr. Stream North
and Common South and his own Meadow West, this parcel is to bear rates for five
acres, and to pay Rates for three acres and one Rod.

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Thomas one Parcel more of Swamp at the End of the Great Meadow containing
one acre and one half and to equal it to other Lands four acres and one half
in all six acres be it more or less, being bounded with Thomas Campfield South
Timothy Baldwin North, Bro. Botchford East, and his own Meadow South
that it is to pay Rates but for one acre.

Henry
Botchford

Henry Botchford hath one parcel of Land of Swamp as a part of
his Division lying in Dradfull Swamp containing one acre be it more or less,
being bounded Southwest John Platts now his own Land North and the Common
East, and West, and John Lane his Lott South.

Timothy
Baldwin

Timothy Baldwin has as a part of his Division taken up in the Great Rock
or West field near to Negroes wall, a parcel of Land containing seven acres
and to equal it to other Lands fourteen acres in all twenty acres be it more
or less, being bounded with John Platts Lott North, and the Common East and
South other Lotts and a high way and Brooks Lott West (that it is to pay Rates
but for four acres three Rods) Note also that it is to goe a high way through it
in the most convenient place only for the Carting of hay from the Meadow
if need bee and he is to maintain bars at each end that may be opened and
shut. The Reason why this is here Recorded and Copied on the other side is
because there was alteration made in it by the measurer and Surveyor for Survey
Cause, I say, and can testify with Daniel Buckingham Regist. And this
about said alteration and Confirmation as it is now was done by Lieutenant
Gouverneur Esq. Stream Deacon Clerk.
