This Indenture witnesseth a bargain or an agreement between the Sachem of Unchachaug Tobaccus and the Inhabitants of Brookhaven else Seatauk concerning a parcel or tract of Land lying upon the South Side of Long Island being bounded on the South with the great Bay and on the West with a fresh pond adjoyning to a place commonly called oucombamack and on the East with a River called Yamphank and on the North it extends to the Middle of the Island provided the aforesaid Tobacus have Sufficient planting land for those that are the true Native proprietors and their Heirs also that either and both parties have free Liberty for fishing fowling and hunting without Molestation of either party and this is in Consideration of a Certain Sum of Money to be paid to the Vallueation of fifty fathom of wampam as Witness my hand the date and day Above written
