These pressents testifieth that Thomas Bigs Junieur haue sould or exchanged his 15 aker lott and medow at the south sied of the Island number 17 william satterly of the one sieide and danell Lane of the other sieide this aboue sayd land and share of medow the aboue saide Thomas Bigs haue for his selue his hairens and asaigns haue

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giuen grantted bargened sould and exchanged unto samuell Turell his haieres and asaigns with all preveledges and apurtenances belonging to the foresaide land and medows to haue and to hould for ever for and in concideration the aboue sayde samuell turell doth for him selue his hairens and asaignes doth giue grant bargin and sell or exchang a three aker lott in the ould feeld on the Reare of william satterlys lott and thorps that was formerly Robart Akerlys unto Thomas Bigs Junior to him his hairens and asaigns to haue and to hould for ever with out any lett or mollestation as alsoe the foeresaide Samuell Turell doth ingaege himselue his hairens and asaigns for to [to] pay to Thomas bigs his hairens and asaigns the Just some of fife pounds starling in work at his trade as thay haue all Redy agreed vpon as he stands in neede of it

These pressents showeth whearas there a covenant or morgeg mad over to Robart goulbery to warant his three aker lott to goulbery from his hairens and where as that the saide 3 aker lott the aboue Thomas bigs sould to the saide goulbery and haue taken it into his hand againe this doe sattisfy all whoeme it may concern that the fore menconed bill and Record is canselled and voyed and of noe efeck

Know all men by these pressents that I Thomas Thorp formerly of brookehaven in the est Rieding of yourksheere vpon long Island and now Remoued into Arter cull government for vallueable causses and concideration me moueing haue given grantted bargened and sould and doe by these pressents giue grant bargin and sell unto m^r Joseph Nash of bosten in the massetussetts mariner all my intire Right and title of a home lott tenn akers more or less with a dwelling house vpon it and orchard within it And a quarter of comeneg for egres and Regres for creatures to feede vpon I say that I Thomas Thorp doth for my selue my hairens and asaigns doth abssollutely sell allinate and make over the aboue saide house and land to the aboue saide Joseph nash and his hairens and asaigns to haue and to hould for ever with all fencings backsieds orchards gardens or what soever prevedge that is within the
