To all Christian People to whome these presents shall Come greteing know yee that I mathias Ieane of Brookhaven in y^e County of Suffolk on Nasaw Island in y^e provinc of Newyourk yeoman for Divers Good Causes & considerations me thereunto moueing but morespeshally for and in Consideration of fifty : fore pounce to me in hand paid before y^e insealing & Delevery hereof by steven Ieane of y^e towne County Island & provinc aforesaid the Resaite Whereof I hereby perfectly acknowledg haue giuent granted alien sold Convayed Released & Confermed & by these presents Doe giue Grant alien sel Convay Release & Conferm unto y^e aforesaid steven Ieane a Certaine Tract of Land Containeing thurty Akers More or Less setuate wethin y^e town ship of brookhaven being Bounded East by y^e land Appertaing to M^e strong West by Mathias Iayne North by y^e High waye Leadeing to y^e Drown : Medow & south by Ebenezer Hulc & william Ieane to haue & to hold all & Singulasr y^e fore said Tracts of Land together With all the in prouements & a pertenances thareunto in any vrisye† apertaing to y^e proper use benefits & behooff of him y^e sd steven Iayne *his [my] Heires and [&] a sigiirsis:(?) forever And I the asaid (?) [promis]‡* Mathias Ieane for mee my heires Executors & administra^e Do covenant promis & Grant to and with y^e saide steven Iayn his Heires & asigns that before y^e insealeing hereof I am the true Sole & Lawfull owner of y^e a boue Bargened premises and am Lawfully Seized & possesed thereof in my owne proper Rite as a good perfit and absolute Estate of inheritanc

**Yamphank Neck* (now spelled *Yaphank*) is the land known as Southhaven between Yamphank Creek, on the west and Connecticut River on the east. The line running north from the creek is the *Yaphank Line* from which the modernly named village of Yaphank takes its name. The neck was claimed by both the Town of Brookhaven and Col.
