know as men by these pressents that I Andrew miller of brookhaven in the est Rieding of yourksheere on long Island for divers good causses and conciderations me here unto moueing as alsoe for and in concideration of a conciderable some of mony al Redy by me in hand Reseued doe allinate bargen make over and sell And doe by these pressents haue allienatted bargened made over and from me and miene for ever fermly sould unto samuell Terell and to his haire and asaignes for ever all that my dwelling house and fue akers of land being and aJoyning unto the saide house sittueat lying and being in brookhaven afore said and is bounded north by the hy way south by the home lott of m^r Richard Smith and west by the hy way and est by the comans together with all houssing fenceing and what soever els is upon the same exsept the nurssery of trees that groweth on the same for him the saide samuell Terell his haire eckseckators Adminestrators and aSaignes for ever to haue and to hould the same as his or thaire owne fre land for ever without the least lett troble hinderence or mollestation of me the saide Andrew miller my haire eckseckators Adminestrators and asaignes or any other parson or parsons whatsoever by from or under me claiming or laying any maner of title or claime to the saide house as it this day is with all doeres windows or bords whatsoever unto the saide house belonging and every part and parsell or any part or parsell of the saide fue akers of land and all fencing that now ar standing on the same alsoe at any time or soe often here after as I shall be there unto Required to sainge sealle and deliver any better or further deede or bill of saele for the saide house and fue akers of land as he the saide

samuell terrell or his asaignes shall by there lerned counsell in y^e
law gett drawne and bring unto me soe to saigne and seale and deliver
in wittnes where of I haue here unto sett my hand and fixed my seale
at southampton this 4th day of march Anno domeny 168^o₁

sember next after the date hereof

At a towne meetting there was chossen Thomas Bigs Junior constable
and william satterly and Thomas helmes overseers

It was voeted and agreed upon that Samuell Turell shall haue the
twenty akers of land or halve acomadations with comeneg belonging
to it that is to say 5 akers in the little neck and the Rest maad up where
it can be found convenient akording as is formerly was Recorded upon
the same conditions butt if the said Turell shuld Remoue with in three
yeeres then the land to Return to the towne againe but if he stayeth
