it can be found convenient akording as is formerly was Recorded upon  
the same conditions butt if the said Turell shuld Remoue with in three  
yeeres then the land to Return to the towne againe but if he stayeth

longer then to be the saide samuell Turells and his haire to haue and to hould for ever

To all Xpien people to whome this pressent wrieting shall come Thomas Bigs Junior of brookehaven in the est Rieding of yourksheere upon long Island yeaman sendeth greeting: Know ye that I the saide Thomas Bigs for and in concideration of my dispossell of a sarten three aker lott of land lying in the ould feeld entailed upon me and my haire maele by Robart akerly deseased unto Robart gouldsbury of the same towne plantter I haue given grantted allineated and maede over unto my eldest son Jacob all my house barn orchard and home lott containeing fue akers lying and aJoyneing unto Thomas Smith his home lott within brookhaven aforesaide to be possessed by him the saide Jacob at the desease of me the said Thomas Bigs and my wife To haue and to hould the fore saide house barn orchard and home lott to him the saide Jacob and his haire maele lawfully begotten in marrage for ever) alwayes provided and upon condition that the afore saide Jacob or his haire doe nott at any time or times here after lay any claime or title unto or any wise mollest the aboue saide Robart gouldsbury his haire or asaigns in his or thaire quiat and peceable in-Joyment of the afore saide three akers of land in the ould feeld other wiese the aboue grantted premisses to fall unto the aboue saide Robart gouldsbury his haire and asaigns as alsoe in case the saide Jacob shuld desease without haire maele then the aboue grantted premisses to fale and goe to my next haire maele sucksessiuly upon condition afore saide in wittnes whereof I the saide Thomas bigs haue hereunto sett my hand and seale in brook(haven)\* This 21 of aperell anno 1681 as alsoe to
