These pressents testifieth that John Roe haue sould unto Samuell Turell his fiteene aker lott at mount misery aJoyneing to John Tomson and butting upon the drowned medow as alsoe he sells unto the aboue saide Turell all his Right and title of his medow ait drowned medow upon the conditions as followeth that the saide Turell is to haue a pece of medow as thay haue agreed upon forth with and the Rest of all this time seven yeares acording to the aboue saide date and the 15 akers of upland forth with I say that John Roe haue sould allinatted and made over from him his hairens and asaigns to the aboue saide Samuell Turell his hairens and asaigns to haue and to hould for ever with timbers trese or whatsoever doth belong to the aboue sayd land

These pressents testifieth that [that] Joeseph daves haue for himselue his haies and asaings given gratted bargened and sould unto samuell daiton of west hapton a pece of medow lying of the west siede of the Run or creke being the west sied of the fire place so comanly called the aboue saide Joseph daves doth sell allinate and make over to the aboue said samuell daiton to him his haies and asaigns for ever to haue and to hould for ever the medow being number 24

Articles Bargens covenants and agrement had made bargened covenanted and agreed upon and concluded by and betweene the Constable and overseers of the towne of brookhaven in the est Rieding of yourksheere upon long Island of the one partty And Edward french of hemsted in the north Rieding of yourksheere afore saide of the other part *Etc(?)*

Imp* that the saide Edward french shall by the ferst day of June next ensueing the date here of Repaire and saddle himselue at the towne of brookhaven afore saide and there ceepe scoole and teach the children belonging to the saide towne to Reede wriete and sipher akording to his best scill and indever

Item The fore saide constable and overseers doth promes and ingaege for and in concideration of the saide Edward french his keeping of scoole to giue unto the saide french his haies &c for his and thaire proper use for ever one three aker allottment within the towne afore saide more or less lying and aJoyning to John geners his three aker allottment west siede and Ralf daiton the est siede as alsoe to pay and
