These pressents testifieth that John Roe haue sould unto Samuell Turell his fiteene aker lott at mount miserry aJoyneing to John Tomson and butting upon the drowned medow as alsoe he sells unto the aboue saide Turell all his Right and title of his medow ait drowned medow upon the conditions as followeth that the saide Turell is to haue a pece of medow as thay haue agreed upon forth with and the Rest of all this time seven yeares acording to the aboue saide date and the 15 akers of upland forth with I say that John Roe haue sould allinatted and made over from him his hairens and asaigns to the aboue saide Samuell Turell his hairens and asaigns to haue and to hould for ever with timbers trese or whatsoever doth belong to the aboue sayd land
