Loose Leaf 14.29.—It is ordered by the constable and overseers that if any parson or parsons shall leave oopen any geat or barrs belonging to the generall Corne feild or the Calfe pasture geat; thay shall be fined for every such Defect five shillings to the publique use; and bee lyable to pay all damage that may ther upon arise.

Know yee yt for Divers Causes him thereunto Moveing & more Especialie for & in Consideration of the sum of nine pounds of Current money to him in hand paid by Josiah Hobart of ye same towne; Have bargained & sould unto ye said Josiah Hobert all yt parsell of Land as it was laid out in ye Eastern plaines by ye said towne of Easthampton unto ye said Samuell Terrell being bounded with ye land of Enock ffithian to ye westward & ye said townes Comon Land uppon all other sides To

have and to Hould for ever in fee simple & ye said Samuell Terrill doth hereby ingage to warrant & defend ; In witnes whereof hee hath sett too his hand & fixed his seale; this; 6th; day of May Ano Dom: 1681.
