That your petitioners sold to the Inhabitants of
Brookhaven a certain parcel of meadow land upon
several rods lying to the westward of East Connetquot
together with liberty to make yards for settling cattle
only upon the upland - That now that the said Inhabitants
of Brookhaven have built houses & broken up land there
without making any satisfaction to y^e petitioners for
the same

Your petitioners therefore humbly pray
that your Excellency may order that
the said Inhabitants of Brookhaven
repay of the said land or give
petitioners Reasonable Satisfaction for
the same And your petitioners shall
ever pray &c.
