To all Christian people to whom these presents shall Come Thomas Terrill of Elizabethtowne In New Jersey sendeth Greeting Know ye: that for Divers good Causes & Considerations him thereunto moveing but More espesially for and In Consideration of the sume of twenty three pounds to him In hand payd by Joseph Stretton of Easthampton In the County of Suffolk upon the Island of Nassaw hath Bargained & Sould unto the said Joseph Stretton one Quarter or fourth part of that whole share of Land and priviledge at Cuntakcutt on the easward end of Long Island : that the said Thomas Terrill bought of Benjamin Osborne with all priviledges proffits Comodities and Conveniances which to the said fouth part proportionably to the said whole share belongeth or any wayes apertayneth To have and to holde : without molestation as Witnes the hand and seale of the said Thomas terrill set to this twenty Nineth day of September 1694
